Taylor and Forgie commenced in 1855 when a young 23-year-old Scottish immigrant Alexander Forgie became part of the Builders and Undertakers known as W.S. Taylor in Tod Street, Gawler.

In the 1880's the Taylor family left the partnership and Alexander became the sole proprietor, with the business concentrating more on building and construction over funerals.

Toward the end of his life, his two sons Alexander Phillip and James ran the business, taking it over after his death in 1902.

The funeral side of the business grew and was one of the leading entrepreneurs in Gawler. They offered value for money, good customer service and up-to-date facilities. They introduced the first motorized hearse outside of Adelaide in 1925 which they also enterprisingly hired to funeral directors from neighbouring towns.

1929 brought the depression and James retired and his share of the business went by his eldest son Gordon, who went on to become sole proprietor in 1938 when Alexander Phillip retired.

In 1963, the building and funeral businesses were split and Gordon's son

Graham, bought the funeral business that comprised little more than some old premises, a 14- year old hearse. But Graham had great vision and set about updating the business completely including relocating to 15 Cowan Street to bring service levels up-to-date by providing an up-to-date mortuary and service chapel. This move gave Taylor and Forgie as good a facility as any other in South Australia, enabling us to combine the best attention with the best facilities.

In 1984 Graham's son Mark and his wife Gizelle took over and continued to grow and modernise the facilities and added staff training, bereavement resources, fully catered refreshments for post-service gatherings, a new cremations centre and chapel expansions culminating in the brand-new Adelaide Road facility in 2017.

### PLAYING TRIVIA

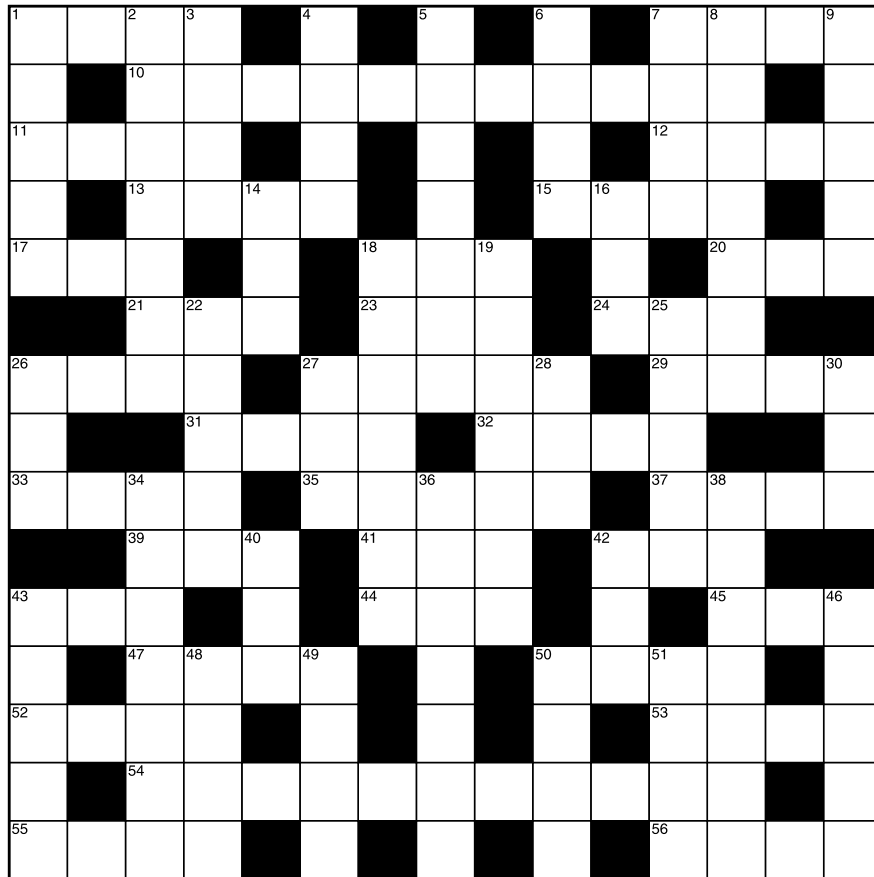
Trivia is a great way to test your memory for general knowledge and history. Simply write your answers beside the questions and check to see how many you got right. Great to do with friends or on your own.

## Helping a Friend in Grief

Losing a family member can be devastating and the support of relatives and friends is essential throughout the grieving process. Here are some ways to help.

### LISTEN WITH YOUR HEART

Helping begins with your ability to be an active listener. Your physical presence and desire to listen without judging are critical helping tools. Don’t worry so much about what you will say. Just concentrate on listening to the words that are being shared with you.

Your friend may relate the same story about the death over and over again. Listen attentively each time. Realise this repetition is part of your friend’s healing process. Simply listen and understand.

### BE COMPASSIONATE

Give your friend permission to express his or her feelings without fear of criticism. Learn from your friend; don’t instruct or set expectations about how he or she should respond. Never say, “I know just how you feel.” You don’t. Think about your helper role as someone who “walks with,” not “behind” or “in front of” the one who is mourning.

Allow your friend to experience all the hurt, sorrow and pain that he or she is feeling at the time. Enter into your friend’s feelings, but never try to take them away. And recognize that tears are a natural and appropriate expression of the pain associated with the death.

### OFFER PRACTICAL HELP

Preparing food, washing clothes, cleaning the house or answering the telephone are just a

few of the practical ways of showing you care. And, just as with your presence, this support is needed at the time of the death and in the weeks and months ahead.

### MAKE CONTACT

Your presence at the funeral is important. As a ritual, the funeral provides an opportunity for you to express your love and concern at this time of need. As you pay tribute to a life that is now passed, you have a chance to support grieving friends and family. At the funeral, a touch of your hand, a look in your eye or even a hug often communicates more than any words could ever say.

Don’t just attend the funeral then disappear, however. Remain available in the weeks and months to come, as well. Remember that your grieving friend may need you more later on than at the time of the funeral. A brief visit or a telephone call in the days that follow are usually appreciated.

### BE AWARE OF HOLIDAYS AND ANNIVERSARIES

Your friend may have a difficult time during special occasions like holidays and anniversaries. These events emphasize the absence of the person who has died. Respect this pain as a natural extension of the grief process. Learn from it. And, most importantly, never try to take away the hurt.

# The *tapestry* of a funeral

A 10-part series examining the individual elements of a meaningful funeral ceremony, which together create a transformative experience.

*We have funerals for many essential reasons. For thousands of years, in addition to offering a way to respectfully dispose of the body of someone we love, they have been a means of expressing our beliefs, thoughts and feelings about life and death. I created this triangle graphic to capture the purposes of the funeral ceremony. I call it my “Hierarchy of the Purposes of the Funeral.” Like Maslow’s famous Hierarchy of Needs, this pyramid puts the simplest and most fundamental reasons at the bottom and works its way up to more esoteric yet significant reasons.*

## Reality

It’s hard to truly accept the finality of death, but the funeral helps us begin to do so. At first, we accept it with our heads, and only over time do we come to accept it with our hearts.

## Recall

Funerals help us begin to convert our relationship with the person who died from one of presence to one of memory. When we come together to share our memories, we learn things we didn’t know and we see how the person’s life touched others as well.

## Support

Funerals are social gatherings that bring together people who cared about the person who died. Funerals are in remembrance of the person who died, but they are for the living. The funeral is a special time and place to support one another in grief.



## Expression

When we grieve but don’t mourn, our sadness can feel unbearable and our many other emotions can fester inside of us. Mourning helps us heal, and the funeral is an essential rite of initiation for mourning. It helps us get off to a good start and sets our mourning in motion.

## Meaning

Did the person I love have a good life? What is life, anyway? Why do we die? There are no simple explanations to these questions, but the funeral gives us a time and place to hold the questions in our hearts and begin to find our way to answers that give us peace.

## Integration

Funerals have a way of getting us to wake up – to think about what we truly care about and how we want to spend our precious remaining days. Ultimately, funerals help us embrace the wonder of life and death and remind us of the preciousness of life.

So these are the crucial reasons why we have funerals. Your funeral director should understand and be able to articulate why we have funerals in general. They should help each unique family create an effective experience, while helping them understand – why we use each individual element of the funeral ceremony.

You see, the meaningful funeral ceremony is a tapestry. Made up of various elements, it creates a transformative experience that is much greater than the sum of its parts. While each family’s ceremony will and should be a unique tapestry, it can only create a tapestry if it draws on the full repertoire of possible elements.

Another metaphor I often use when talking about meaningful funerals is that of a puzzle. It is only through combining the pieces of the ceremony – the viewing, music, readings, eulogy, symbols, actions and the gathering afterwards – that the complete picture emerges. While each element may seem random or superfluous when considered separately, they are essential to the final experience.

*Over the coming editions, of this puzzle book I will be reviewing the reasons why we use each of the main elements of funeral ceremonies. At a time when some families are questioning the value of funerals, and some elements in particular, my purpose in this series is to educate families, about each element so that they in turn can make the best possible choices.*

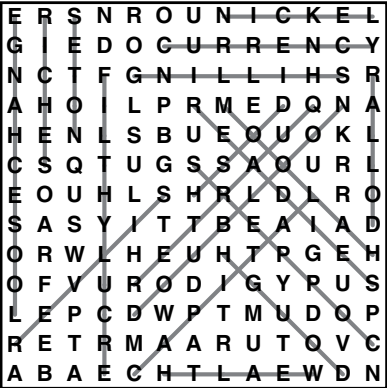

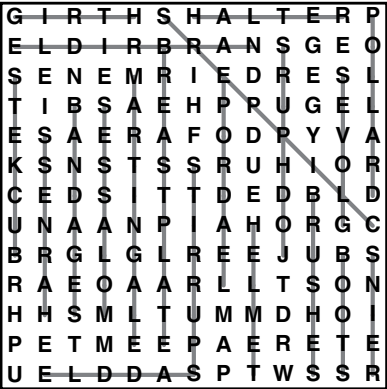
